Refuge this Week

In 1 Samuel 30, David's downward spiritual trend begins to turn, but only after he endures a devastating tragedy. This experience conveys a sobering truth to four distinct groups of people

- 1) To the discouraged: Find strength in God (vv. 1-8a)
 After leaving the Philistine army, David and his men return to
 Ziklag only to discover that the Amalekites have raided the city
 and taken all the women and children captive. When the men see
 the devastation, they break down and weep. David mourns too,
 but then the Bible says something powerful: he "found strength in
 the Lord his God. In those moments when grief surrounds you,
 when you feel depressed, discouraged, and confused, you don't run
 from God; you run to Him.
- 2) To the tired: Find rest in God (vv. 8b-10)
 After seeking God, David sets out to pursue the Amalekites and rescue the people. Along the way, 200 of his 600 men grow too exhausted to continue and stop at the creek to rest. There are many reasons we become spiritually tired, but in those moments, we must find our rest in Christ. He restores the weary. Don't mistake your pause for your purpose ending.
- 3) To the lost: Realize God recovers (vv. 11-20)
 David meets an Egyptian who leads him to the Amalekites' camp.
 There, David strikes them down and recovers everything that was taken. The writer makes it clear: David got it all back. In the same way, Jesus recovers everything. He restores all. There's nothing you've lost that God isn't on a mission to redeem and restore.
- 4) To the arrogant: Learn grace (vv. 21-30)
 When the Israelites return to the men they left behind at the creek, the ones who fought tell David that those who stayed shouldn't receive anything. But David reminds them it wasn't their plunder, and it wasn't even his. It was all God's. We are all recipients of God's grace. The victory belongs to Him, yet He chooses to share it with us.
